Reflections

Pastor Dr. Daryl King, Sr. was born March 31, 1962 in Oklahoma City, OK. The first born of Lawrence D. & Virgerine King. He is preceded in death by his mother and father a step brother and one child Lawrence J. King.

Rev. King went to school in Oklahoma City, OK where he graduated from Northeast High School in 1980. He excelled in football and baseball and was known as the famous Daryl King. He was also a dynamic wrestler, earning him the nickname "Killer". After high school he furthered his education at Connor State University then transferred to Central Arizona. He later transferred to Oklahoma State University, then to Northwestern Oklahoma State University where he earned a Bachelor of Science Degree and met his wife Giselle. They had a whirlwind romance and were married on August 10, 1985. To this union 4 children were born.


Pastor King worked in finance for several years before starting his real estate company, DK & Associates. He coached at Langston University and worked at Guthrie Job Corp. He was a man of many talents. If he couldn't fix it, it wasn't broke. He always used his mechanical knowledge for the Church and anyone else who needed it, without asking for anything in return. At any given time you could find him puttering around the Church fixing whatever needed "fixin".

Pastor King came to Christ at the age of 7 and has been running for the Lord ever since. He was baptized and joined Antioch Baptist Church. His family later moved their membership to Siloam Missionary Baptist Church under the pastorage of Rev. Jay S. Ross. Rev. King worked diligently as Deacon, on the Finance Committee, on the Sunday School Board and wherever he was needed. Rev. King accepted his call to the ministry in 1990 and preached his first sermon in October, 1991. After serving as Interim Pastor at Ebenezer Baptist Church and Pastoring at St. Paul Baptist Church and St. Mark Baptist Church Rev. King went back to his home church and was named the assistant pastor of the Siloam Missionary Baptist Church. On October 23, 2016 Rev. King was installed as pastor of the Siloam Missionary Baptist Church. This was a great day in the life of Rev. King. He was so honored to be the Pastor of this great church.

Pastor King worked with the General Baptist Convention of OK (GBC of OK) as well as the Northeastern Baptist District Association. He held many offices including Moderator of the district and 1st Vice President of the GBC of OK. He also received a Doctorate of Ministry from the Fellowship Bible Institute, another milestone in his life. Rev. King loved his family and friends, but he was a no nonsense person when it came to the work of the Lord.

Pastor King fought the good fight and was called home on December 2nd. He is now resting in the arms of the Lord. He leaves to cherish his memory his wife of 35 years Giselle King of the home; one son, Daryl King, Jr. of Houston, Tx; two daughters, Danielle Miles (Treviaun) of Oklahoma City, and Danetra King of Dallas, TX; One grandchild, Audrey of OKC; One brother David King of Norman, OK; one sister Cheryl King-Williams of Dallas, TX; a loving aunt, Idella Jackson; lifelong friend Herbie Warren, and a host of other relatives and friends.




